<p>Ensuring full staffing of English department.</p> <p>Employing a temporary member of staff to cover long term staff absence in English.</p>	<p>Ensuring a full complement of subject specialist English teachers so that the quality of remote learning and face-to-face learning in English remains good or better.</p>	<p>Attainment / progress rates at GCSE and A-level are equal to or higher than those in 2018/19.</p>
