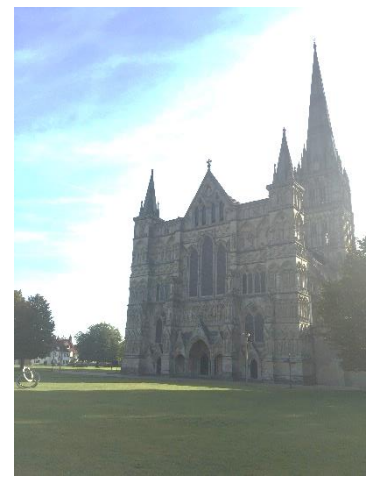

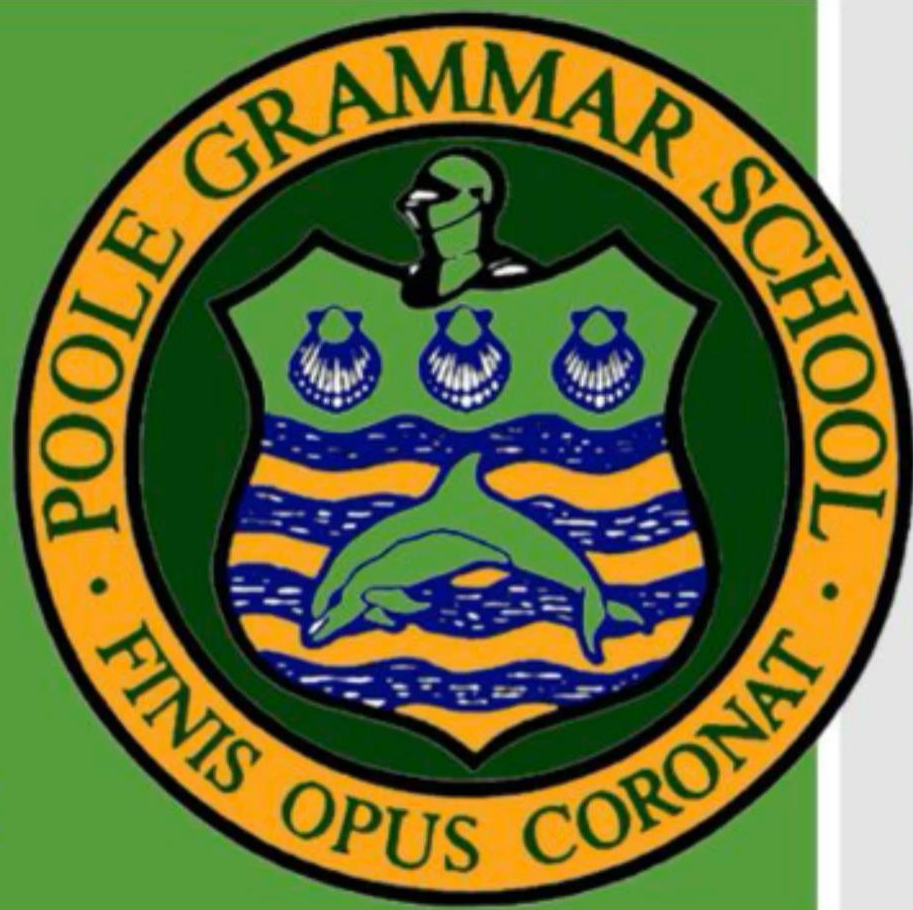

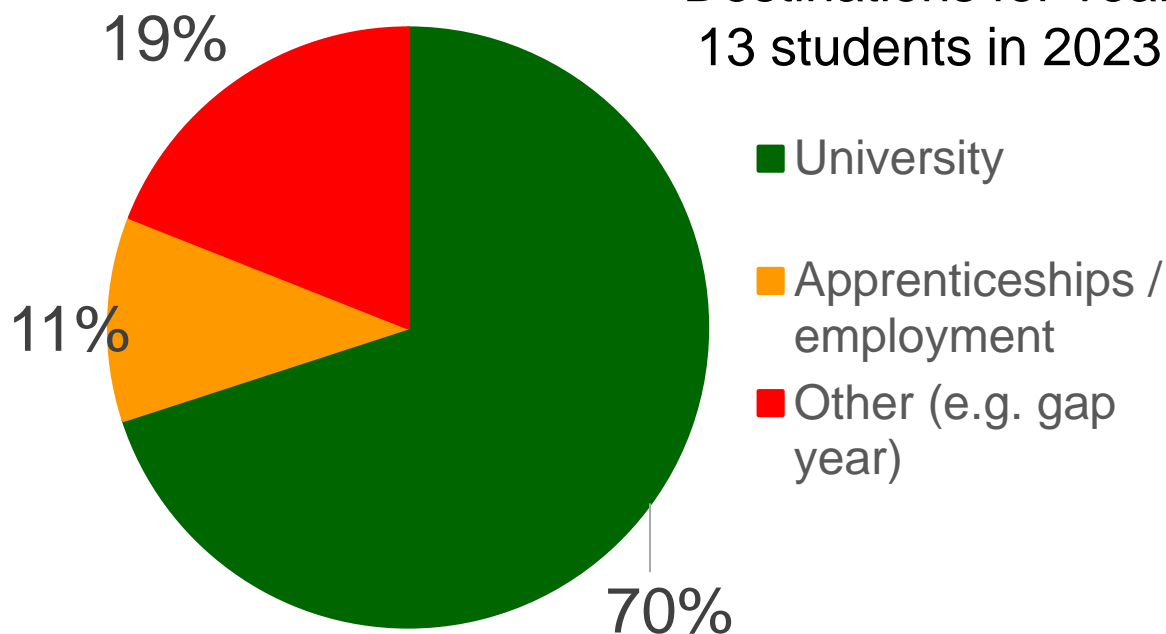
Destinations

Most students go to a Russell Group university

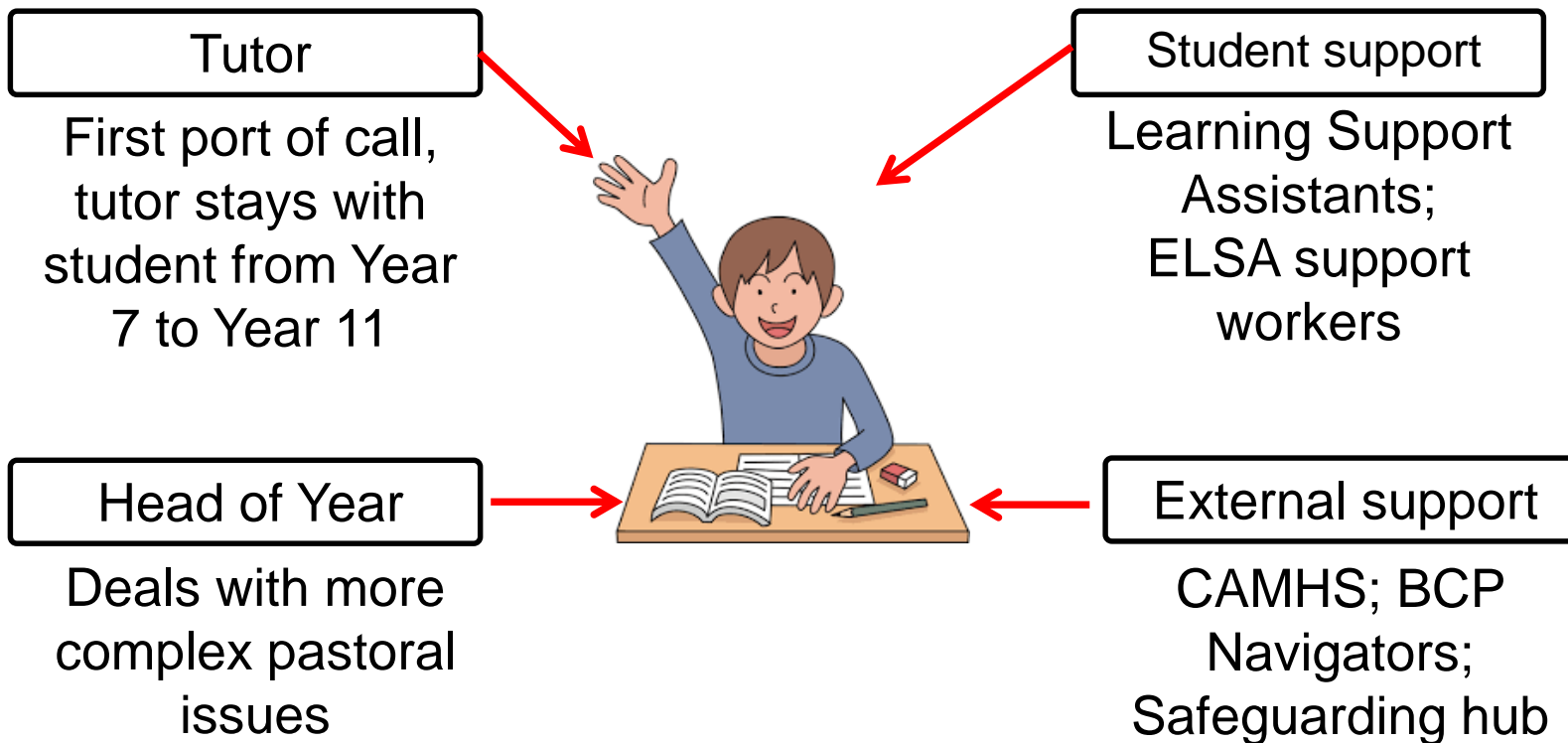
